HIGHLIGHTS OF ELIGIBILITY

OPTION 1

- Satisfactorily completed an ACGME, AOA or RCPSC-accredited primary care residency (primary care specialties include family practice, internal medicine, pediatrics and general surgery)
- Practiced emergency medicine on a full-time basis for five years and accumulated a minimum of 7,000 hours in the practice of emergency medicine

OPTION 2

- Satisfactorily completed an ACGME, AOA or RCPSC-accredited primary care residency (primary care specialties include family practice, internal medicine, pediatrics and general surgery)
- Completed a graduate training program approved by the BCEM
 - Completed a 24-month emergency medicine graduate training program
 - Completed a 12-month emergency medicine graduate training program plus practiced emergency medicine on a full-time basis for an additional 12 months before or subsequent to completing the graduate training program
